Opening of Chambers Bay generates big buzz

Chambers Bay, the links-style layout outside of Tacoma, is coming down the homestretch for a grand opening in June. Situated less than an hour south of Seattle, Chambers Bay is destined to be one of the most unique recreational opportunities on the West Coast, offering panoramic views of Puget Sound, neighboring islands and the Olympic Mountains. "The excitement surrounding Chambers Bay continues to build," said Pierce County Executive John W. Ladenburg.

Designed by world-renowned architect Robert Trent Jones II, the 18-hole layout is highlighted by dramatic elevation changes, cliffs, windswept dunes and native grasses. Pierce County officials are confident the scenic venue will grow to attract golfers and tourists from across the nation as well as professional and amateur tournaments.

Joe Wisocki has taken the helm as general manager and Kristin Wells as sales and marketing director.

Butterfield Trail debut on horizon



Construction is nearing completion at Butterfield Trail Golf Club in El Paso, Texas. Developed and owned by the city of El Paso's Department of Aviation, the par-72, desert-style layout was designed by internationally acclaimed architect Tom Fazio.

Fazio took advantage of the site's distinctive desert topography, incorporating natural sand dunes and native flora and fauna. The daily-fee course will serve as an anchor to the airport's surrounding property and business as well as a catalyst for future commercial development.

Complementing the course will be a spacious practice facility and an 8,800-square-foot clubhouse.

In late January, KemperSports named Marty Wells as Butterfield Trail's general manager. Wells has been involved with the property since September 2005 as course superintendent and continues to supervise grow-in. He will assume responsibility for daily operations upon the facility's opening, scheduled for this spring. Wells' resume includes experience in golf course management, operations and agronomy. ●

Carlsbad's first public golf course on track for summer unveiling

KemperSports is preparing The Crossings at Carlsbad, the city of Carlsbad's first public golf venue, for a summer opening. Infused with massive pines, oaks and sycamore trees, the Greg Nash-designed, championship track winds through a coastal terrain highlighted by views of the Pacific Ocean and surrounding shoreline. Upon completion, a 23,000-square-foot clubhouse will accommodate a golf shop, banquet facilities, a spacious dining room equipped with a full-service kitchen and an outdoor deck with ocean views. A fully lighted practice facility and public trails to link to the city's extensive Trail System will complement the golf course.

Jeff Perry recently appointed general manager, will be tasked with preparing the Southern California facility for a successful summer debut and will oversee daily operations upon opening. ●

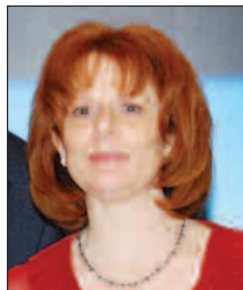

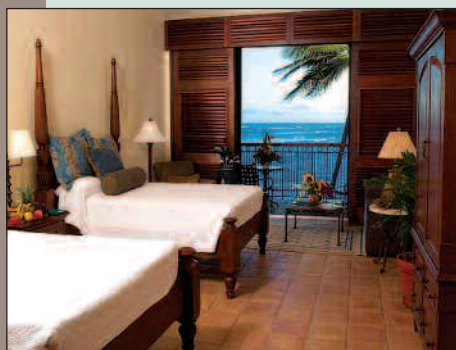
"Providence has the potential to become one of the premier family recreation and golf communities in Florida," said KemperSports President and COO Steve Skinner.

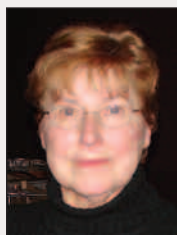

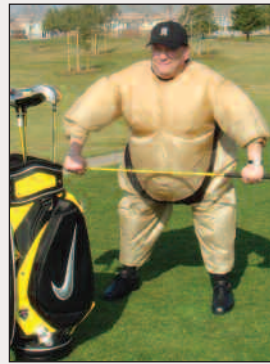
