Less than eight months after Chambers Bay debuted in June 2007, the USGA awarded the Pacific Northwest golf course not only one but two championships – **the 2015 U.S. Open and the 2010 U.S. Amateur Championships.**

Chambers Bay will be the first golf course in Washington and just the third municipal golf course to host the U.S. Open, one of the game’s four major championships.
