Fabled Harding Park in San Francisco will build on its history by hosting The Presidents Cup, a biennial, match-play event that pits the finest U.S. players against a team of international players from outside Europe. **The Presidents Cup will make its first West Coast appearance at Harding Park in October 2009** with team captains Fred Couples and Greg Norman leading the way.

THE REVIVAL OF HARDING PARK

Originally designed by Willie Watson in 1925, Harding Park’s history is laden with prestigious golf events, including the 2005 WGC-American Express Championship. The course underwent an extensive renovation in 2002 to reclaim its stature as one of the great public golfing experiences in the United States and to restore the famed layout to world-class standards.

The City of San Francisco, PGA TOUR and KemperSports will work together to provide a world-class golf experience at The Presidents Cup 2009, when the best players in the game will again descend upon Harding Park.
